Call to Confession: Logically, rationally, we have no need to confess. Our petty sins pale in comparison to the great evils of our time. But this is the day God tossed logic out the window and raised Jesus from the dead. So we must throw out our claims of innocence, and confess how we have not lived as God's Easter people.

¹ After the Sabbath, at dawn on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to look at the tomb. ² There was a violent earthquake, for an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and, going to the tomb, rolled back the stone and sat on it. ³ His appearance was like lightning, and his clothes were white as snow. ⁴ The guards were so afraid of him that they shook and became like dead men. ⁵ The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid, for I know that you are looking for Jesus, who was crucified. ⁶ He is not here; he has risen, just as he said. Come and see the place where he lay. ⁷ Then go quickly and tell his disciples: 'He has risen from the dead and is going ahead of you into Galilee. There you will see him.' Now I have told you." ⁸ So the women hurried away from the tomb, afraid yet filled with joy, and ran to tell his disciples. ⁹ Suddenly Jesus met them. "Greetings," he said. They came to him, clasped his feet and worshiped him. ¹⁰ Then Jesus said to them, "Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee; there they will see me."

What would you do if you came to the cemetery the day after a friend was buried and found the grave empty? That is what happened to Mary. The tomb where Jesus had been buried less than 48 hours before was empty.

An earthquake. An angel of the Lord. The stone removed from the entrance to the tomb. The guards like dead men. The appearance of the angel was like lightning.

Angel's message to the women: Fear not; Jesus is alive; See for yourselves; Go and tell.

The women obeyed the angel. They were still afraid. They were also filled with joy.

On the way they met Jesus , alive and well. They worshipped Him. He told them to not be afraid and to go and tell His brothers.

Fear mixed with joy.
